Ericusa sowerbyi Kiener, 1839

This is a rare opportunity to obtain a really interesting example of this eastern Australian endemic volute. Trawled from 25 fathoms of water of eastern Victoria in Bass Strait.

This attractive specimen measures 170mm and features typical chestnut coloured 'lightning' patterning over a rich apricot-pink ground. As a last 'theatrical flourish' the animal has created a remarkable 'flared' outer apertural lip. These shells are extremely difficult to obtain in gem condition. This shell does have a couple of fine cracks on the inner edge of the flare lip extension (visible only on close inspection) otherwise a it is a remarkably preserved specimen - despite the rigours of being trawled from the depths!
