These two specimens of Chicoreus cornucervi Roding measure 81 mm [brown specimen] and 88 mm [light-colored specimen]. The fronds are in great condition, on both specimens, but not all are perfect. The apertural tooth is intact on both as well. The lip and canal are excellent on the light-colored specimen. On the brown specimen, the canal is also excellent but the lip is not fully mature and there are a few etchings on the penultimate and earlier whorls. The brown specimen has a growth mark.
